


North Central FSET Region

What is FSET?

FSET stands for FoodShare Employment and Training. The FSET program is a **no-cost** program that helps FoodShare members build their job skills and find jobs.

Wood County and CW Solutions are proud to be partners in providing FSET services for the North Central region. The North Central region includes: Adams, Forest, Langlade, Lincoln, Marathon, Oneida, Portage, Vilas, and Wood Counties.

Through the FSET program, we work with members to identify their individual strengths and needs.

Who Can Take Part in the FSET Program?

FoodShare members ages 16 or older can take part in the FSET program.

How Do I Sign Up for the FSET Program?

Ask your agency for a referral to the FSET program.

How Can FSET Help?

If you take part in the FSET program, a case manager will work with you to develop an employment plan to meet **your needs**, which may include:

- Developing employment goals
- Increasing job skills/education
- Developing a resume
- Earning a general education development (GED) certificate
- Getting job leads
- Getting help with support services
- Getting referrals to community supports

You can choose the activities that you feel you need to help get a job.

FSET Program Activities

There are a number of activities available in the FSET program, including:

- Employment search
- Develop/update resume
- Career exploration
- Job skills training/certification
- GED/high school equivalency diploma (HSED) classes
- Basic education/literacy
- Work experience
- Job retention services

How Many Hours a Week Do I Need to Take Part in the FSET Program?

If you choose to take part in the FSET program, **we will work with you** to figure out the number of hours that meet your needs. If you are taking part in the FSET program to meet the federal work requirement for adults ages 18 through 49 with no minor children living in the home, we will make sure you get enough hours to meet the requirement and keep getting FoodShare.

Other Help

If you take part in the FSET program, we can provide you with other help in order for you to do your FSET activities. This includes, but is not limited to, help with:

- Transportation costs (e.g. gas cards, bus or taxi passes, etc.)
- Work-related costs (e.g. work clothes, shoes, etc.)
- Education costs (e.g. certification courses and materials, etc.)
- GED/HSED tests
- Child care

These services are only available if you continue to take part in the FSET program for at least 12 hours each month.
