It is a great pleasure to announce that Langlade County partnership with Cirrinity has once again succeeded in the PSC Grant Cycle. Out of 146 applications and over 495 hundred million requested, our application was awarded for the fiber build-out plan in Polar, Norwood and Rolling.

State grant helps UW-Stevens Point, partners meet forestry workforce needs



Addressing a need for skilled workers in the forestry industry, the Wisconsin Forestry Center at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point will receive a state grant of up to \$8 million. This Workforce Innovation Grant will support education and create a pipeline to forestry careers for the next generation.


#### Wisconsin Automation Implementation Grant

Effective immediately the WEDC working with the Wisconsin MEP Network (including WMEP Manufacturing Solutions) is offering the Wisconsin Automation Implementation Grant to help lower the risk of automation technology implementations by providing expertise and the offsetting of some of the costs.

The two-step process enables manufacturers to select the most appropriate technology, plan effective implementation, and receive financial support for acquiring that technology.

The process starts with individual manufacturers completing an AutomationAdvisor™ project with WMEP Manufacturing Solutions (WMEP) or the UW-Stout Manufacturing Outreach Center (MOC), resulting in an automation implementation roadmap with equipment recommended through that assessment. This roadmap lays out a sequenced technology acquisition and implementation plan tailored to the specific operation.

Completing the roadmap makes companies eligible for financial support up to \$35,000 for acquiring the equipment listed in the roadmap. <u>Click here for more information!</u>



#### **Main Street Bounceback Grants:**

The deadline was extended to December 31, 2022!



The goal of the <u>Main Street Bounceback Grants</u> program is to provide financial support to businesses that move into existing vacant commercial properties, helping to create a foundation for long-term success for themselves and their communities.

The Main Street Bounceback Grants program provides \$10,000 to new or existing businesses and non-profit organizations moving into vacant properties in Wisconsin's downtowns and commercial corridors. Funds can be used to pay leases or mortgages, operational expenses and other business costs related to the newly opened location. The program is open to new or existing businesses opening a new location or expanding operations in a vacant commercial space.

# Langlade County residents can help get broadband in their communities!

#### Taking a simple internet speed test will identify areas of need

Access to broadband is vital for the economic health and growth of Wisconsin. Yet many homes and businesses have no broadband access or internet service speeds that fall below FCC standards.

State and federal grants are available to bring broadband to underserved areas around the state, but in order to tap into those grants the state must identify those areas of greatest need.

To help ensure broadband access, Langlade County and partners statewide are working to roll out a simple internet speed test, with the assistance of a grant from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC). We are asking residents and businesses to take the test to help establish where support is needed.
