Entrepreneurship

- Expanded the Entrepreneurial Program to all virtual business education series
- Graduated 5 students in Spring of 2022 and 14 students in Fall of 2022. Bringing the total number of graduates to 108 since the program was implemented in 2015. Totally 39 new businesses started.
- In 2022, (3) new businesses started from the ETP Course in Langlade County
- Four Potential New Businesses Entrepreneur Graduates were awarded a total of \$11,000 in business start- up grants; These grants are only disbursed as reimbursement and the business must be open.
- Continue to work with key partners like SBA, SBDC, WWBIC, NEWCAP, and GRID to assist entrepreneurial candidates.

Workforce Development & Education

Objective: Partner in developing the next generation of skilled workers and engaging and building relationships with our youth.

<u>Labor Pool Improvement Project/Education: Youth Retention program</u>

- Working with Antigo High School Work Co-Op Program and hired Kayleigh Parilek as an intern for the Summer of 2022
- Working with Regional Talent Cultivation Specialist on building our Pathways in Wisconsin for students looking to enter the workforce. This is done through Inspire Grow North. It includes matching students in demand, high paying careers starting in high school by pairing them up with local companies and doing apprenticeships, dual credits and job shadows. Successful program example: Karl's Transport
- Continue to meet with key partners to be educated on the resources that are available in order to connect businesses with residents, students and out of area individuals to help with workforce needs in Langlade County: Langlade County HR Group/Manufactures Alliance
- Continue to monitor the labor pool and unemployment rates and report out
- Brought Job Services like Forward Services to NTC Antigo Campus

Community & Economic Opportunity

Objective: Improve the quality of life in Langlade County.

Image Enhancement Project for 5th Avenue

- Continue to work with businesses to fill empty buildings in our downtown corridor. The Mainstreet Bounceback Program was a huge success in filling the spaces
- Distributed \$25,000 in façade and building/business improvement in downtown Antigo corridor

Broadband

- Officially formed a Langlade County Broadband Commission with representatives from Towns, Elected Officials, Residents and Industry.
- Continue to collect data to determine the unserved and underserved areas in Langlade
 County to seek opportunities to expand broadband utilizing Speed Test Data and GIS Mapping
- Supported and help implemented grant paperwork necessary to the PSC for Wittenberg Wireless LLC and Langlade County to bring 65 miles of fiber to three (3) Townships that included Rolling, Norwood, and Polar for 528 homes and businesses. This grant was awarded at \$1,657,500 with towns and Cirrinity matching \$1,105,000.00
- Continue to work with the Public Service Commission, The National Telecommunication and Information Administration for grant opportunities and new technology that can serve the needs of rural areas

Tourism

Objective: Deliver exceptional customer service, provides reliable travel information that in return generates and economic impact to businesses and Langlade County.

Tourism plays a direct role in Economic Development. Keri has been an excellent facilitator to marketing all of the tourism activities and opportunities in our county.

- Awarded City of Antigo Hotel/Motel Tax Marketing Grant \$43,468.77 to implement
 Destination Marketing Strategy for Langlade County
- Expended \$58,147.00 of the Destination Marketing Grant for Langlade County Tourism Destination Marketing
- Antigo · Langlade County Welcome Center had 2,676 Visitors come through the Welcome Center. They took 2,004 informational brochures.
 - Rebecca Kubacki was hired as a summer intern for the Welcome Center. She is attending UW-Madison for Journalism.
 - Michael Clay was hired in September 2022 as the Welcome Center Assistant.
- Working with Antigo/Langlade County Chamber of Commerce for implementation of the 2023 Langlade County Visitors Guide with Recreation Map.
- Continuing to invest and upgrade the LangladeCounty.org Tourism Website and App
- Continue to Collaborate with Langlade County Forestry Department and City of Antigo Park and Recreation Department to market Langlade County Recreational Opportunities for tourism by participating in outdoor shows, promote and manage alcinfo.com website, and market on several websites, radio and print avenues.
- Continue to participate in a regional tourism effort through Northcentral Wisconsin ITBEC
 Group by marketing Langlade County as part of a region approach.
- Participated in Nicolet-Wolf River Scenic Byway meetings for marketing effort of the byway.
- Partnered with Kim Swisher Advertising on Google Ads Marketing Campaign
- Partnered with Social Siren Marketing on social media campaigns and Google Ads.
- During October, 170 people checked in Antigo as an Ice Age Trail Community for the Mammoth Hike Challenge
- Continued sending out Everbridge mass notification on trail updates and participating in joint marketing of Everbridge and Alcinfo.com.


